## **AREAS OF INTERVENTION**

## Yobe, Adamawa, Borno states


The protracted crisis in Nigeria is in its thirteenth year. The insurgency by non-state armed groups and counterinsurgency has left millions of people in need. As violence continues unabated, particularly

Yobe states in North-East Nigeria through a representative office in Abuja, a coordination office in Yola, main field bases in Mubi and Maiduguri, and satellite/deep field bases in Damaturu in Yobe state, Michika in Adamawa state and Ngala, Bama and Mafa in Borno state, covering a total of 17 local government areas. DRC is currently developing activities in the North West of the country, where humanitarian presence is limited.

**DRC** has been operational and delivering lifesaving assistance to displaced and conflict-affected communities in **Nigeria** since **2015**. DRC Nigeria maintains a strong presence across Borno, Adamawa, and



across Northeastern Borno, Yobe and Adamawa (BAY) States, civilians bear the largest burden of the conflict, including attacks on civilians, forced displacement, abductions, destruction of civil property, sexual violence, and other violations of their rights and dignity. Mass displacement, prolonged disruptions of livelihoods and trade, and the destruction of critical services (health, WASH, and educational infrastructure) have put internally displaced persons (IDPs) and host communities in a state of extreme vulnerability. The impact on freedom of movement, livelihoods, markets, and humanitarian access has also resulted in high levels of food insecurity and malnutrition across the region. According to the 2022 HNO, 8.4m people in BAY states are in need of humanitarian assistance, with 4.3m in need of protection assistance. As of June 2022, just over 2m people were displaced in the BAY states, with 80% being women and children, while in the country at large, 2,4m people are in acute needs.
