

Since 2007, DRC has been present in Central African Republic and has a long-standing operational presence in the prefectures of Ouham, Ouham-Fafa, Lim Pendé and Ouham-Pendé, which allowed it to gain a strong acceptance within the supported communities and local stakeholders. DRC pursues a multi-sectorial approach focusing on 3 axes - (i) emergency response, (ii) protection and social cohesion, (iii) food security and livelihoods - addressing emergency situations, implementing recovery activities and, where feasible, initiating development programs. Through the implemented projects, DRC aims at addressing root causes of conflict and displacement through social cohesion and dialogue.



Since December 2020, the humanitarian situation in the Central African Republic has continued to deteriorate. In 2023, 3.4 million people will need humanitarian assistance and protection, an increase of 10 per cent compared to 2022, mainly due to the government's updated population count, which has grown by more than 24%, reaching 6.1 million people. Among those in need of humanitarian assistance, 2 million people have such complex and severe needs that their physical and mental well-being is at risk.

The sectors with the largest number of people in need of humanitarian assistance in 2023 are water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), food security, health and protection, covering between 2.7 and 3 million people. Food security and WASH are the sectors with the increase greatest needs, with 600,000 (+25 per cent) and 200,000 (+7 per cent) more people in need of assistance compared to 2022.
